Make Your House Brighter This Winter

Who hasn't used the cooler weather as an excuse to binge-watch Netflix while snuggled in a blanket on the couch. But come January, staying indoors can feel less like a treat and more like living in a cave. Here's how to make your house lighter and brighter with more natural light indoors.

Take the Screens Off Your Windows: You'll get 30% more sunlight shining indoors without screens on your windows. Sunlight warms your rooms and saves money on your heating bill. Make sure to store the screens where they won't get damaged. You will want to replace them in the spring to keep the sun out and run your cooling system less.

Change Your Bulbs: Replace your incandescent bulbs and their yellowy light with LEDs, which produce a brighter, whiter light. The higher the K rating on the bulb, the cooler and whiter its light. For cool, white light, opt for a bulb rated 3,500K to 4,100K. For blue-white light that is closet to natural daylight use a bulb between 5,000K and 6,500K.

Add Mirrors: Make the most of winter light by bouncing it around the room with mirrors.

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7 Hacks You Can Do Now to Make House Cleaning Go Faster

Stained surfaces, carpets and stinky appliances—they all hurt your home's market value in the end. And, they're no fun to look at every day, either. Get your house back together quickly with these easy hacks using items you most likely already have!

1. **Kitty Litter for Oil Spills:** Oil spills on the garage floor are unsightly, but are easy to clean with kitty litter. Pour some on, let it sit for at least 30 mins, and then sweep it up.
2. **Nail Polish to Stop Rust Rings:** If metal cans of shaving cream leave rings on your sinks or tubs, paint the bottoms with clear nail polish. Now there is a layer of protection.

5. **Lemon for Stained, Stinky Microwaves:** Pour half a cup of water into a bowl. Slice a lemon and squeeze the juice into the water, put the lemon in the bowl. Microwave the bowl for three minutes, then let it sit for five minutes. Remove the bowl and wipe down the microwave. Super easy!
6. **Car Wax for the Stovetop:** Next time you clean your metal stovetop, give your future self a break. Buff a small amount of car wax onto the metal surface. In the same way it works to protect your car it works here. Making future cleanings quick and easy.

Easy Mistakes Homeowners Make on Their Taxes

As you prepare your tax returns for the last year, be careful not to commit any of these common tax mistakes. Tax professionals say these home-related mistakes can cost you money or bring the IRS to your doorstep.

Deducting the Wrong Year for Property Taxes: You take a tax deduction for property tax in the year you actually paid them.

Confusing Escrow Amount for Actual Taxes Paid: If your lender escrows funds to pay your property taxes, don't deduct the amount escrowed. Make sure you deduct the exact amount paid on the property tax bill.

Deducting Points Paid to Refinance: In many cases, you can deduct in full the points you paid your lender to secure your mortgage. However, if you pay points, you must deduct the points over the life of your new loan.

Failing to Track Home-Related Expenses: Common tax mistakes are often of omission: not keeping records. If the IRS comes back to you, don't be scrambling to compile your records. File or scan and store home office and home improvement expenses receipts and other documents as you go.

Forgetting to Keep Track of Capital Gains: If you sold your main home last year, don't forget to report capital gains on any profit above the excluded amounts.
